Access to Information Procedure Rule 4

Notice of Private Item - Schools Capital Maintenance Programme 2017/18

The County Council's Constitution provides that at least 28 clear days before a private meeting (a meeting, or part of a meeting, of the executive decision making body during which the public are excluded) the executive decision-making body must give notice of its intention to hold the meeting in private (including a statement of the reasons for holding it in private) by making the notice available at County Hall and at the venue for the meeting (if different) and publishing it on the Council's website.

It is anticipated that on 13 June 2017 a report by the Corporate Director Children and Young People Service regarding the '**Schools Capital Maintenance Programme 2017/18**' will be considered by the Executive. The intention to make this key decision is published on the Forward Plan.

It has recently become apparent that two appendices of the report will contain exempt information as described in paragraph 3 of Part 1 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (as amended) ("Information relating to the financial or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information)") and it is considered that the public interest in maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosing the information. This part of the meeting may therefore be held in private.

This Notice gives the required 28 days' notice of the intention to hold this part of the Executive meeting in private.
